### STUDENTS

To empower students and to develop responsibility, leadership skills and community feeling in them the school cabinet is formed. It comprises of the Head boy, Head Girl, Vice Head Boy, Vice Head Girl, Jr. Head Boy, Jr. Head Girl, House Captains and Vice Captains, Discipline In-charges, Sports In-charges and Club In-charges.

The House system begins from class III. Captains and Vice-captains of four houses Emerald, Ruby, Sapphire and Topaz are elected by the students and teachers. The strength of students lie in abiding by the code of pupil's conduct.

# **ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES**

- ➤ Learning is the partnership between dedicated teachers and motivated students. The faculty brings a depth of intellectual expertise and academic curiosity to the classroom by experiential learning and happy classroom teaching.
- > The achievement of student is reviewed continually through class test, Periodic test, Term end exams and revision tests.
- > The academic session commences from April and ends in March.
- ➤ In the AISSE 2023 our students performed brilliantly. Aryan Kuntal topped with 97.4%, Anshita Agarwal 97%, Kriti Garg 96.8% and Anika Agarwal 96.6% marks.
- ➤ In AISSE 2024 Sidra Khan topped with 97.2%, Tanmay Daryani and Adarsh Verma both secured 96.8%
- > We follow common syllabus and exams schedule meant for all the schools of the congregation.
- > The Nursery class began on April 8 from the new academic session 2024-2025.

# **CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

- ➢ In compliance with the Skill module introduced by CBSE under NEP 2020 for middle school, workshops were held for standard 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> on beauty and wellness, handicafts, travel and tourism, mask making, cooking etc.
- Metaverse 360 VR education programme was organised for class I to X.

# SCHOOL ASSEMBLY
